

# *Listed buildings in Hethe Parish*

## *All Grade 2*

*Church of St Edmund & St George (12<sup>th</sup> Century Church; restored by G.E. Street in 1859)*

*Headstone in St Edmund & St George Graveyard*

*Church of the Holy Trinity (built 1832)*

*School House, the Holy Trinity (late 18<sup>th</sup>/early 19<sup>th</sup> Century school house)*

*Hethe Cottage (dates from early 18<sup>th</sup> Century; originally a farmhouse)*

*The Old Rectory (Rectory, now house; late 17<sup>th</sup> Century)*

*Palmer House (early 18<sup>th</sup> Century)*

*Burma Cottage (18<sup>th</sup> Century)*

*Manor Farmhouse, Cottage and cart entrance (originally a farmhouse from the 17<sup>th</sup> Century)*

*Hethe House (late 18<sup>th</sup>/early 19<sup>th</sup> Century; was the Dower House; lower floors used as Village Hall in the 20<sup>th</sup> Century; sold by auction in 1986)*

*The Round House (originally two cottages now one dwelling; mid-18<sup>th</sup> Century)*

*Montague Farmhouse (late 17<sup>th</sup> Century farmhouse)*

*Rose Cottage (originally two houses, now one dwelling; early/mid 18<sup>th</sup> Century)*

*The Muddy Duck (late 17<sup>th</sup>/early 18<sup>th</sup> Century; previously known as the Whitmore Arms, originally the Maltster's Arms)*

*The Old Stone House (early 18<sup>th</sup> Century; known as "Caberfeidh" in 20<sup>th</sup> Century)*

*South Lodge, Shelswell Park*

*Willaston Farmhouse*
