



We are developing, with partners a Local Nature Recovery Strategy (LNRS) with, and for, the county of Oxfordshire.

The strategy will identify locations to create or improve habitat in areas that can provide the greatest benefit for nature, and the wider environment. The final strategy will include a list of local priorities for biodiversity and a map showing areas where people and organisations could focus action to start achieving countywide priorities.

Mapping actions does not make them compulsory, instead it is expected to increase the opportunities for funding nature recovery actions.
